This week we learnt the following with a grown-up...

- * To use the language of comparison to describe sets of objects that they can see.
- * To understand the concepts of 'more than' and 'fewer than' when describing how many objects there are in each set. 'Fewer than' is used rather than 'less than' because the focus is on countable things.
- *To consider what is the same and what is different about a set of objects
- * To copy and continue repeating patterns AB, ABC, ABB, ABBC
- * To hear, read and blend the following graphemes: \mathbf{f} (as in fin) \mathbf{ff} (as in huff) \mathbf{l} (as in lolly) \mathbf{ll} (as in hill)
- * Read and write cvc words eg f-i-t p-u-ff l-o-g t-i-ll
- * Recap the term 'digraph' when referring to 2 letters that make 1 sound eg. ff ll
- *To read the tricky word -go

- *To listen to the story of Goldilocks and The Three Bears and retrieve simple information


