This week we learnt the following with a grown-up...

- * To continue to practise subitising (instant recognition) of small amounts and sounds eg. beats of a drum, claps
- * To begin to see smaller amounts within larger amounts (conceptual subitising)
- * To describe patterns using language of across, bottom, top and diagonal
- * To use fingers to represent amounts to 4 in different ways
- * To copy and continue repeating patterns AB, ABC, ABB, ABBC
- * To hear, read and blend the following graphemes: \mathbf{u} (as in up) \mathbf{h} (as in hop) \mathbf{r} (as in rip) \mathbf{b} (as in bat)
- * Read and write cvc words eq c-u-p h-a-t r-e-d b-a-t
- *Read the tricky word 'no' by sight

Here are a few ideas for how you could support your child's learning at home.

- Continue to share your Learn to Read and Love to Read books can you be a sound detective and spot any phonemes we've learnt so far –u, r, h, b?
- Spot any familiar phonemes in Rick the Duck and attempt to decode some of the words https://phonicsplaycomics.co.uk/comic_ph2_rick_the_duck.html
- Whilst reading your love to read book, talk to your child about what is a letter, word and sentence. Encourage them to count how many words there are in a sentence. Spot any letters or tricky words that they've been taught
- Practise subitising small amounts of objects (to 5). Encourage the children to show the amount on their fingers we've been practising up to 5
