This week we learnt the following with a grown-up...

- *To consolidate our understanding of the composition of 5 and the numbers within it
- * To explore ways to represent numbers using the Hungarian number pattern (die pattern).
- * To understand the '5-ness' of 5, and provide structures that will support exploration of its composition and its relationships with other numbers.
- * To secure our understanding of the pairs of numbers that make 5
- * To use double dice frames to begin to explore 6 and 7 as numbers that are composed of '5 and a bit'.
- * To estimate how long an item is in non-standard units
- * To revisit the phoneme z (as in zip) and zz (as in jazz) and practise reading and writing them in CVC (consonant, vowel, consonant) and CVCC (consonant, vowel, consonant, consonant) words

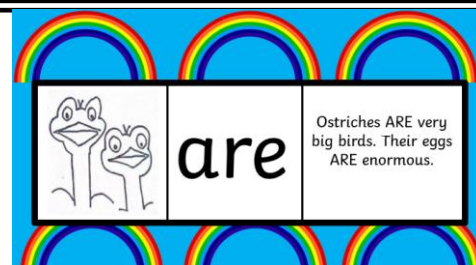
Eg. zip zips zipper zigzag buzz buzzer

- * To read the tricky word – are
- * To read the book 'Brilliant Boats' practising our reading skill of 'explaining'. We discussed the different types of boats and whether we would like to go on them
- *To understand the term 'material' refers to the stuff things are made from and recognise wood, metal, plastic, glass, paper, fabric and card, describing their properties.
